## "Lessons by Paul: Faith in the Time of Crisis Part 3"

I Corinthians 12:1-10

## **REVIEW:**

- First 6 ways of how Paul dealt with crisis situations in his life
  - 1. Prepared to pay any price to follow God's will for his life
  - 2. Don't be put off by people telling you that cannot do what God has told you to do
  - 3. Even in the difficult times look for the opportunities to serve God
  - 4. The circumstances may not be able to be controlled but our responses to them can be (F-E-A-R: Faulty Expectations and Assumptions of Reality)
  - 5. Be realistic about your circumstances but never lose site of the fact that God's will is still active for it to be accomplished
  - 6. Pick your battles and the places to get involved His will not yours!
- The times of crisis and difficulty will come our question is how will you deal with them?
- Three other men who faced crisis times yet through their responses were used mightily of God
  - o Daniel
    - Taken as a prisoner of war by the Babylonians Dan. 1:1,6
    - Desired to have them learn the ways of the captors -1.5
    - Stripped of his identity physically and mentally 1:7
    - Never forgot who he truly was 1:8
    - In the midst of it was shown favor by those around and over him 1.9
    - Suffered through plots of enemies; attempts on his life -6:4.7
    - Served with power and influence for 3 kings 2.48
  - Joseph
    - Sold by his bothers into slavery Gen. 37:28
    - Falsely accused of a crime 39:17-18
    - Spent years in prison unjustly 39:20
    - In the midst of it was shown favor everywhere he went -39:21
    - Rose to the position of  $2^{nd}$  in command of all of Egypt -41:40
  - Nehemiah
    - The people are still in exile by the Persians and Babylonians but have been returning to Jerusalem Neh. 1:2
    - This is the time of the third return trip (first two told in Ezra)

- Nehemiah receives permission from King Artaxerxes to return to Jerusalem and begin rebuilding the city walls – 2:6-9
- He was shown great favor by the king -2.8
- He was opposed by many for what he wanted to do 4:1,3,11; 6:2
- Completed the task and the brought the nation back to order -7-13
- All of these men and many more had every reason to doubt, become discouraged, quit, complain, even turn from God but none did and God accomplished His purposes
- Last 4 of what we learn from Paul on how to handle our times of crisis
  - o Be willing to fight the good fight and not run from the issues you must face
    - This does not negate picking the places of our involvement and battle
      - Most men of the Bible that we read about, even Jesus, had times when they hid, fled or simply did not engage in what was happening
      - Seek God before you act (Matt 6:33)
    - Faith in God means trusting that the outcome will be according to His will
      - David ran at Goliath (I Sam 17:38)
      - What is your goliath today
        - o Are you running at him or away from him?
        - What is God telling you to do?
  - o Be ready to accept God's intervention in ways you do not expect
    - Do not be quick to dismiss unusual ways that God may answer prayer
      - Elijah God used ravens to bring him food twice a day I Kings 17:6
      - Lot 2 angels accompanied him on his journey out of the city –
        Gen. 19
      - Paul Acts 16
        - God used the power of His creation in an earthquake (Acts 16:26)
        - The head of the guards cared for Paul and Silas after the earthquake (Acts 16:33-34)
          - Don't eliminate someone by how they look, sound, or even feel to you
          - God can and will use anyone and anything!!
  - See each and every trial as a way to grow in faith, strength, courage, hope, and credibility.
    - So much of what happens in these times of trouble of crisis are determined by how we respond
    - Every one that we pass through will either make us better or bitter the choice is ours (James 1:2-3)
    - Elijah, Lot, Paul all came out better in their walk with God because of what they had gone through and how they dealt with them

- It does not mean their problems ended
- Paul was ultimately martyred but what he accomplished for God had a purpose that resonated for the ages and will continue until Jesus comes again
- We do not know the impact of how we live our lives will be used of God for years to come
- When we begin to live this way we cannot allow pride to enter
  - Paul received a great gift from God and we permitted to see heaven (2 Cor 12:1,4)
    - First heaven is the atmosphere of the earth (Hosea 2:18; Dan. 7:13)
    - Second heaven is the created cosmos (Gen. 1:14-18)
    - Third heaven is paradise, the dwelling place of God (Luke 23:43; Rev. 2:7)
  - God did this to encourage Paul and sustain him during his years of struggle
    - BUT God allowed Paul to deal with a "thorn in his flesh" (2 Cor. 12:7)
    - Demonic activity permitted yet limited by God
    - The memory and consequences of his past?
  - Why? To prevent him from becoming prideful by what God had blessed him with (2 Cor. 12:7)
- The measure of our lives can often be seen not in how we deal with the good and easy times, but how we deal with the times of trial
  - Let the light of Jesus shine so brightly in you that people may not even know whether your life is in a time of calm or a time of crisis
  - Do that all to His glory because it is His strength that will sustain you in the times of crisis!
